Marge At the 10am service we are going to Writes sing what I expect is a new song for most of the congregation. The title is "God and Man at Table are Sat Down." The song

celebrates Holy Communion (this week's theme). It is a song of celebration, but you wouldn't think so if you only listened to the tune because it is written in a minor key.

Happy songs are written in major keys; sad songs are written in minor keys. Or so the rule of thumb goes. So why did the composer so obviously celebrating the joy of communion between God and Jesus followers and Jesus followers with each other compose the song with such a "sad" melody? (Listen for yourself on YouTube)

I was wrestling with this on Saturday morning and suddenly the penny dropped. In this song we joyously celebrate with the words what God in Christ did for us and the communion that is now ours with Him and each other, but we express with the sad melody the tremendous personal cost and pain experienced by God (Father, Son, and Spirit) to bring us home to the table. Oh, the depth of His love.

Interestingly, the final chord at the end of the song is E major as though expressing God's joy in seeing what His agony accomplished. Blessings, *Marge*

HOW'S IT GOING?

The model Jesus gave us for prayer is known as the Lord's Prayer. In Luke's gospel it is clear that it wasn't memorised as something that had to be repeated out loud. Rather, it was a series of topics to be covered.

This week I have been trying to spend about 10 minutes each day on just one topic as shown in Luke 11:2-4, working through all 6 in the week.

Prayer is talking with God. It is good to take the example Jesus has given, and talk to him about the topic of the day.

Holy is your name. Talk to him about his creation, wonder, variety, how extraordinary it is. The sacrifice of Jesus. The gifts and fruit of the Holy Spirit.

Your kingdom come. Evangelism, outreach, the way of life following God.

Daily bread we need. Practical requests for needs, NOT wants.

Forgive us. We sin whenever we break God's commands or fall short of acting like Jesus in thought or action.

Help us forgive others. Very challenging. Any areas where we harbour bitterness or anger.

Help us in tough times, especially when tempted.

So, how's it going?
