HOW'S IT GOING?

One of the ways of growing in faith is through regular Holy Communion..

God made careful preparation for it about 1,500 years before Jesus. When He rescued the Israelites from Egypt, He told them to put the blood of a lamb on the doorposts of their houses and then stay within the house. That way the angel of death would see the blood and pass over that house.

The blood represents the blood of Jesus shed on the cross that not only forgives our sin, but protects us from eternal death because we trust what Jesus says and does.

When the Israelites were in the desert, God fed them supernaturally with manna, representing His body, that came very day except for the sabbath. On the day before He sent twice the amount. This happened for 40 years until they entered the Promised Land that represents heaven.

All this was remembered annually at the Passover festival. It was at the Passover festival that Jesus instituted the Holy Communion so that we would remember His death, body, (bread) and His cleansing blood (wine).

As God went to so much trouble to prepare for this sacrament, we treat it with respect and reverence as we partake weekly. Do you do the same?

God in Pursuit – Lessons from the Book of Jonah by Robert M. Solomon

Most of us know the story of Jonah who miraculously survived being in the belly of a whale for three days. In 'God in Pursuit' Robert M. Solomon guides us through a fresh look at this story, and there is much to learn. Jonah was a prophet who was called by God to go and give a prophecy of destruction to the people of Nineveh. Jonah does not want to go so he runs away. Jonah's disobedience gets him, and others into a pickle. We then see God's amazing love, patience and mercy at work. We see how God works all things together for good according to his purposes.

In the end Jonah goes to Nineveh and proclaims the message from God throughout the land. The people humble themselves and repent. They cry out to God who relents. He doesn't destroy them, he saves them. In Luke 15 Jesus tells us, "I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent." Yet Jonah does not rejoice over an entire nation repenting. Jonah gets angry and sulks. Did Jonah believe those wicked Ninevites didn't deserve God's mercy? Was he concerned for his own reputation?

The conversation between God and Jonah reveals much about the character of Jesus and the character of Jonah. Jonah was prepared to go on mission for God. To begrudgingly be obedient. But was he prepared to love? God was loving, patient and merciful to the wicked people of Nineveh as well as his grumpy servant. God shows us He wants us to go on mission with Him and He wants to go on mission within each of us. Both missions are important. He wants to transform us into Christ's image. The question is, are we willing?

I highly recommend this new addition to the parish library. It may well reveal to you whether you lean more towards the character of Jonah or the character of Jesus. It's broken up into themes with reflection questions at the end of each section. It would work just as well reading it as an individual or using it as a study guide for a small group.

A poem from the book describes where Jonah was at and is thought provoking for us:

'You Jonah' by Thomas John Carlisle

And Jonah stalked
To his shaded seat
And waited for God
To come around
To his way of thinking.
And God is still waiting for a host of
Jonahs
In their comfortable houses
To come around
To His way of loving.

This book is in our library for you to borrow.
