

HOW'S IT GOING?

The Power of Forgiveness

The story of Tārore and her father, Ngākuku, is one of forgiveness and peace, that changed the lives of so many people across Aotearoa.

Tārore was a 12 year old girl who lived in Waharoa. She would read the Gospel of Luke aloud to her whanau and iwi, which impacted them and changed the way they lived. After she was tragically killed by an enemy tribe, instead of vowing revenge, Ngākuku spoke of forgiveness and trusting in Jesus. One day, the warrior who killed Tārore asked Ngākuku for forgiveness, and so peace was made between their tribes.

Ngākuku would have drawn strength from Jesus to help him forgive the man who killed his daughter. We too, can draw strength from God to help us forgive those who have hurt or wronged us. You may also want to talk to someone about this, which is valuable in bringing healing in this area of forgiveness.

Never underestimate the grace and healing power of the Gospel of Jesus, even in the most tragic and complex of circumstances.

Is there someone you need to forgive? What are you going to do about it?

FUTURE OF THE FAIR

Vestry at its meeting on Thursday had an honest and robust discussion about the future of our Parish Fair.

Our annual fair has been going on for over 100 years and is looked forward to by the community and has been a blessing for many. It has also been a good fund raiser for the parish over the years.

However, over the last few years, it has been increasingly difficult to put the Fair on in its current form. The reasons are many and include:—

- significant decrease in number of helpers due to—
 - ♦ shrinking congregation
 - ♦ ageing congregation
 - other commitments of parishioners on Fair Day
- Several stalls no longer available or potentially unavailable as circumstances of the stall providers change
- clashes with other community events at the same day and time
- Robin's inability to find a replacement for organising the fair. This is the last year he will be able to do it on his own. He is happy to train someone and assist them in the future, but no longer do the job himself. (If you are interested in taking it over, please see Robin ASAP so training can begin with this fair.)

Vestry decided that the parish needs to seriously consider the viability of continuing the Fair in it's current form. This will be on the agenda for our next AGM in 2026.

Parishioners are asked to pray and consider—

- how might the Fair continue in a way that our current congregation can run it?
- what alternative event(s) might be held that could bless the community and raise funds which our current congregation would be able to run?

Please don't wait until the 2026 AGM to let Vestry know your ideas. Write them down and give them to Marge so we can include them as part of our AGM papers.

OTHER VESTRY SNIPPETS

The missionary family we support currently serving in SE Asia will be permanently returning to NZ on Dec 14th. Vestry unanimously agreed to give them \$1,000 to assist them with their relocation.

As we will no longer be assisting this missionary family into the future. Vestry decided to include the Motueka Parish in their place in our "missions giving" budget for 2026 for \$1,000. This is to assist Motueka with their 2026 diocesan levy. Each parish pays a levy to assist with the costs of the Anglican Centre in Nelson. However, the formula for assessing each parish's proportion has, for years, been unfair to Motueka. Synod next vear will vote on a new formula which will hopefully result in a more fair sharing out of the cost. At Synod this year, there was a swell of support for other parishes to help out for next year.

Vestry was confident in these decisions due to our encouraging financial position. Thank you to everyone who supports the work of this parish.
