

A number of you may know that over the last three years I have had a twisted colon on several occasions. Sometimes it fixed itself, but other

It happened again this past week, resulting in two days in hospital. I have now been booked for an urgent operation on Tuesday to remove part of the colon. I shall be in hospital for about 4-6 days.

As this is a major operation, I expect to be on light duties for a few weeks thereafter. Hopefully my mind will still be reasonably sharp, and, after the Bishop's visit next weekend, I will be able to do most of my service roster duties.

I won't mind the occasional visit while I'm in hospital from Wednesday onward, but would ask that visits are kept brief and occur during the official general ward visiting hours (10am-2pm; 4pm-8pm).

HOW'S IT GOING?

Last Sunday we looked at the first diagnostic question to assess our spiritual health:

"Am I in love with Jesus?"

There are over 700 commandments in the OT, but Jesus narrowed all of them down to two—

Love God Love your neighbour

He made it clear that loving God with all our being was the 1st and greatest commandment; and the second was to love our neighbour.

The truth is we cannot properly love our neighbour unless we are fully loving God. So often we get so busy doing "good things" that we spend very little time simply being with our Lord (remember Mary & Martha in Luke 10 and the church at Ephesus in Revelation 2). In the end the true loving of our neighbour begins to wane as well.

So if our love for Jesus is cooling, what can we do? Answer—remember what drew you to him in the first place: his perfect love for you. Paul defined true love in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. Look it up and substitute "Jesus" every time the word "love" or "it" is used. Read it slowly and remember afresh how Jesus loves you. Then, in relationship with him, go and love your neighbour the same way.

AVOIDING ALTAR CANDLE FIRE

When lighting the candles, it is ESSENTIAL to avoid part of the match falling into the wax. If it does happen, blow out the candle and see one of the clergy about getting it out. Better to use two matches than risk a bit of match falling.

What happens is that the dead match acts as a second wick, which can cause the candle to burn rapidly or drip wax down the sides.
